In addition funding was supplemented by the PTA who spent £500 on skipping ropes to support skipping in school and approximately £1000 across the two school sites on equipment to support P.E lessons and play time provision. They also raised a further £4000 towards a trim trail on the Year 2 site.

The school also bid successfully for 'Big Lottery' funding of £11,000 which bought a climbing frame and soft surfacing which is used extensively at playtimes and lunchtimes. This has had a significant impact in improving the climbing and upper body strength of a large number of children in Foundation Stage and Year 1.
