2016 was the first year in which children were assessed against the new National Curriculum. The criteria set in order to be at the 'expected level' were extremely demanding and children had to achieve every single criteria in order to achieve the standard. We are particularly delighted that we were significantly above national averages in terms of the percentage of children working above/at a greater depth in reading, writing and maths.

We are not complacent however and want to improve significantly next year in terms of children meeting the expected standard in writing.
