Comberton Village College (CVC) SCo Primary Lead Teacher (PLT) from CVC is provided support to teachers and quality first teaching to the children in Year and Foundation Stage.	£4800	Teaching staff to be 'skilled up' through working alongside a qualified P.E. teacher. Children in FS and Year 1 to have opportunity to be taught high quality P.E and for class teacher to be able to be team teach, observe and assess children more accurately in dance, gym and games on a termly basis. <b>Staff were clear that this had sig difference to their practice. Staff team taught lessons and learnt a great deal that they then implemented in their own lessons.</b>
Bikeability bikes x15- To allow FS and Y1 children to develop riding, balance and road safety awareness skills	£2500	Developed balance and gross motor skills from start of Spring term. Able to use bikes all year round not just during bikeability sessions. Year 1 children were able to continue to practise the skills they had learnt in FS. Children were clearly more aware of simple Road Safety skills and used these skills in their everyday play. <b>Staff expressed that they felt children had increased confidence. Other staff felt confident enough this year to do bikeability lessons themselves during the year and follow plans.</b>
Balanceability 6x 30 minute sessions for 1 Foundation Stage classes	£580	Developed balance and gross motor skills from start of Spring term. Improvement on previous year in terms of GLD for Physical aspects of EYFS curriculum. Children were clearly more aware of simple Road Safety skills and used these skills in their everyday play. <b>Staff expressed that they felt children had increased confidence. Other staff felt confident enough this year to do bikeability lessons themselves during the year and follow plans.</b>
Access to SSP(School sports partnership) courses	£50	Staff, including new P.E coordinator were able to develop their skills and support other staff and children. <b>P.E leader to identify courses that she or other staff should attend.</b>
Swimming- All Children in Year 2 are given the opportunity to have 4 sessions of swimming each during the Summer Term- cost of swimming teacher and	£296+100= £396	<b>All children developed their water confidence in Year 2 prior to going into Key Stage 2. Approx 15% of children had never had swimming lessons before and 2 had never been in a pool. Confidence was greatly improved and 18% were able to swim at least 5m by the end of the session with 6 children able to swim at least 10m. All children said they felt more confident in the water.</b>

Key Stage 1 Dance/Gym Specialist A specialist teacher is employed to teach high quality dance and gymnastics to the all of Key Stage Two.	£5534	Children had opportunity to experience high quality teaching of dance and gymnastics from a specialist. Children who show particular flair or love for dance and gym can also be signposted for lunchtime and after school clubs. <b>Year 2 staff fed back to P.E leader re their own confidence and the experience/skills that they and the children are developing. P.E lead/HT observed dance teacher. Parents and visitors commented on the quality of performance during end of year production and during class celebration assemblies.</b>
Games specialist employed to teach high quality games sessions to all Year 2 classes.	£2984	Children have opportunity to experience high quality teaching of dance and gymnastics from a specialist. Children who show particular flair or love for particular sports can also be signposted for lunchtime and after school clubs. <b>Year 2 staff to fed back to P.E leader re their own confidence and the experience/skills that they and the children are developing. P.E lead/HT to observe games teacher.</b>

Dance competition- Year 2 children have the opportunity to take part in a whole class dance competition held annually during the Autumn term	No cost	<b>Children had opportunity to practise a performance with trained dance teacher and to perform in front of large audience at Impington Village College. Over 20 parents attended and supported the event. 10/11 children then participated in after school dance classes.</b>
Chance to shine- Cricket provision. 6 hours of coaching for all year 2 children from Level 3 MCC coach during the Spring term.	No Cost	<b>Children to have the opportunity to develop cricketing skills. Talent and enthusiasm identified. School has close links with both MCC lead of Allstars project and Histon Cricket Club and signpost children to participate outside school through assemblies, 'flyers' etc At least 20 KS1 children then took part in 'All stars' cricket at Histon CC.</b>
