Balanceability 6x 30 minute sessions for all 4 Foundation Stage classes	£1760	Develop balance and gross motor skills from start of Spring term. Children to also be aware of simple Road Safety skills, be better equipped for cycling to school and support healthy lifestyles where appropriate. <b>FS staff to fill in simple assessment form to show improvement in skills and confidence.</b>
Cost of annual servicing bikes for Balanceability bikes and regular check up	£250	Cost of caretaker time to ensure bikes are always in good condition to use both in Balanceability sessions and during curriculum time. <b>Caretaker to fill in and update risk assessments and annual check sheets on EVERY system/</b>
